# **4-H Enrollment**

The new 4-H year kicks off on Sept 1, 2022.

All 4-H enrollment is done online at **Texas.4Honline.com**. All of our clubs except for one are now online. We hope that Cowpoke City is up by the end of the week. Chartering the clubs this year has been a bit frustrating. Once Cowpoke City is online, Club Manager, Danelle Ivey, will get those shooting sports classes up and going.

Enrollment is done every year by both the 4-Her and volunteers.

We encourage at least one parent per family also enroll as a volunteer leader. Per Texas 4-H guidelines, if you transport a child other than your own to a 4-H activity, you should be a registered 4-H volunteer.

4-H enrollment is \$25 per 4-Her until Nov 1 and then the fee increases to \$30. Adults can register as volunteers for \$10.

#### What is validation and why do we do it?

Validation provides proof of ownership of an animal by a certain date. There are many reasons this is important but mostly because we want to ensure that the 4-Her has ownership and possession of the animal in plenty of time to prepare it for the show.

If you are showing any animal at the County Show or at a Major, you must complete Quality Counts. You complete this your first year, then when you change grades from 5th to 6th and then 8th to 9th. QC numbers must be added to your entry forms. This course does take time to complete so don't wait til the last minute!



# Ag Product ID & Livestock Skillathon

These two contests go hand in hand together! Ag ID teaches about Texas Crops and industry. Livestock Skillathon teaches about types of feed, meat cuts and other livestock industry practices.



Agricultural Product Identification contest provides youth the ability to further their knowledge and skills when evaluating ag products grown in Texas. For the Ag Product ID contest, 20 Texas agricultural products are selected and exhibited at separate stations. Contestants select the correct identification of each product from four possible answers. Each station also has one multiple choice question pertaining to the product on display. Questions are general to the industry that produced the product, (i.e. Texas' national ranking, economic impact to Texas, general nutrition content, region of production) and specific to the individual product that is on display (i.e. cooking method, use, growing season, specific nutrition of the cut or variety).


The Livestock Skill-a-thon contest tests a 4-H member's knowledge and comprehension of animal science and livestock management practices. The contest provides an opportunity for youth to gain and develop production livestock skills and life skills through a competitive environment.


#### **Local Jackpot Shows!**

#### How 4-H Works

(This is a repeat of a post from last year but has great tips!)

We have so many new 4-H families this year and I just want to welcome you and Thank you for joining us! I'm getting a lot of the same questions and I know many more of you probably have the same or similar questions but haven't asked yet. I understand as I'm not a big question asker!

How 4-H works after you've joined your Club is as simple or as complicated as you'd like it to be. We have 4-Hers who do one or 2 projects and others who do as much as can fit into their schedules. We can offer projects as long as we have volunteer leaders who give of their time.

Your 2 County Agents: David Graf and myself can't be everywhere and Club Managers can't either as much as we'd all love to!

Many of our projects can be self guided at home. For example, if you want to learn how to make a jelly and your parent or family friend knows how, that can be a project. We do focus a lot on projects that usually end up with a contest opportunity at the end of the project but that's not always the case. Much of the time, the project is just the learning opportunity which is the most important.

If you would like to share a hobby or skill that you have or know someone with a skill, we'd love to set up the opportunity for you to share that. It can be a one time commitment or a short series.

We will host county wide opportunities as much as possible throughout the year for all to attend if possible. Clubs may also host opportunities throughout the year as well. All that info will be shared on our social media and in our Friday emails.

For our shooting sports projects, you must be coached by a Texas 4-H Certified Shooting Sports coach. Even if you've been shooting for years, a 4-H Coach needs to work with you to be able to sign off that you're doing things safely and by 4-H guidelines. If you're a parent with a love of shooting sports, we'd love to have you as a coach! Even if you just want to coach your own child, becoming a certified coach will help!

My advice to anyone new to 4-H is to pick one project and dive in! Get with me or your Club Manager and see how we can help. Even if we don't have a specific plan for that project, your request may be what we need to get it going! We have some great 4-Hers who have been in a few years and would love to answer your questions and be a mentor as well.

My goal for this year and each year is to support you in whatever project or projects you choose. There's no such thing as too many questions or contacting me too much to ask those questions. That's how we all learn!
