Entry Submission Rules & Guidelines:

- Must be a 4-H member (single entry submission)
- Can use two ink colors in addition to the color of the shirt. Example: If the
 design calls for red, white and blue, one of those colors should be the color of
 the shirt. Do not select white as the shirt color choice.
- . The design should fit on the front side of the t-shirt (12 inch design maximum)
- · Be creative and develop an original design
- Simple designs are more effective and easier to screen print. Designs may have to be modified slightly to include the proper clover logo and to clean up details.
- Entries should be emailed to Cory.hundl@ag.tamu.edu by February 15, 2023
- · Must be JPEG or PNG format
- · Include the following in your email:
- o 4-H Member's Name
- o Grade
- County
- Attach Image/Design
- Entries will be judged based on 4-H Age Divisions
- o Clover Kids (K-2nd grade)
- o Junior (3rd 5th)
- o Intermediate (6th 8th)
